Bringing out future skills

"LIKE LIONS" supports people to be fit for the future. The idea is to prepare our children and ourselves for dealing with a "VUCA world" (Volatile, Uncertain, Complex, Ambiguous). "Like Lions" stands for the idea of developing qualities such as strength, courage, resilience, indomitable spirit in children - real lion skills.

"LIKE LIONS" means

... to raise strong, courageous, independent children who are not afraid to take risks and pursue their dreams. The term "lion" is used to symbolize strength, courage, perseverance. Symbolically, this means that parents are preparing their children to become strong, self-confident individuals who are able to overcome life's tricky challenges with courage and determination.

In emotional terms, "Like Lions" stands for the great responsibility and challenges that come with raising children and shaping them into strong and successful personalities who can hold their own in the world.

But it also expresses the joy and self-affirmation we feel when we watch our children grow and succeed in life.

The classical VUCA ...

... refers to difficult basic prerequisite and framework conditions for families, children, parents or in professional systems in which people live and/or come together.

STATUS QUO - Current state

QUO TENDIMUS - Where do we go

Here, too, we use the acronym VUCA. In this context, however, it stands for Vision, Understanding, Clarity, Agility. The V stands for the development of a vision. What is the most optimal and advantageous course of action in a particular situation? The U stands for understanding a certain situation in its entirety. What circumstances and conditions are those affected confronted with? The C stands for the clarity and consciousness, with which things can be perceived and categorized with all available senses. What needs to be considered? What can be useful? What can be a hindrance? What is the optimal solution scenario? The A stands for agility, which is used to think, plan, organize and finally turn everything into a targeted activity - whether in a dynamic high-performance team, as a heterogeneous group, in pairs or as an individual.
